## The Afterlife

- I. The Egyptians believed that to live comfortably in the afterlife, you needed to bring some items with you.
  - A. These were buried within chambers of the tomb
    - 1. Food- real or painted on the wall, family members also brought offerings to the mortuary temple
    - 2. Clothing and Jewelry
    - 3. Furniture
    - 4. Weapons
    - 5. Tools
    - 6. Shabtis- dolls of servants that will come to life
    - 7. Pets- animals were mummified
    - 8. Leisure- games, musical instruments
    - 9. Transportation- boats and chariots
- II. The book of the dead was written and left as a guidebook for the Underworld
  - A. Scenes of Horus leading the person to Anubis who is waiting by the scale of truth
    - 1. The heart (soul-ba) is judged and weighed against a feather
      - a. if the soul was lighter than a feather the person joined Osiris, who is waiting in the afterlife.
      - b. if the soul is heavy, Ammut (a monster part dog, part crocodile, part hippo) will devour it

## The Funeral

- I. The funeral of the deceased was a procession.
  - A. Boats floated down the Nile from the East bank to the West
    - 1. The West was associated with the setting sun and death
    - 2. The body's boat was pulled while the others were oared
  - B. Family, priests, professional mourners (dressed in blue), servants bearing offerings and objects for the tomb and the afterlife followed.
    - 1. Women wailed
    - 2. Men stopped shaving and eating
- II. The ritual "Opening of the Mouth" was performed by the priest
  - A. The priest tapped the mouth of the mummy which was thought to give the body back its sense so that it could see, eat and speak in the afterlife.
- III. The mummy was placed into the tomb
  - A. The body was placed in its coffin, then into the sarcophagus.
  - B. Offerings were made.
  - C. A banquet was held outside the temple.
  - D. Items buried in the chambers.
  - E. Tomb was sealed and the funeral was over.
