Homes of Egypt

- I. The main building material was mud bricks mixed with straw and pebbles to strengthen them
- II. There were 2 types of homes
 - A. Common
 - 1. One room hut
 - 2. Small courtyard facing the street
 - 3. Windows placed high in the walls (for cooling)
 - 4. Flat roof
 - B. Wealthy
 - 1. Multi levels and rooms (townhouse)
 - 2. One section was for greeting strangers, servants and business
 - 3. One section was or entertaining guests
 - 4. One section was the family's private living quarters
 - 5. Kitchen in back or house or on roof
 - C. Difference in country and city homes
 - 1. Country homes were typically one story
 - 2. City homes were 3 or more stories (land was scarce)
 - D. Furniture was simple
 - 1. Low wooden stools with 3-4 legs and a woven leather seat
 - 2. Low tables (for wok and eating)
 - 3. Wooden bed with woven "mattress", wooden animal-shaped legs and a footboard and headrest.
 - 4. Lamps made of simple pottery containing oil and a wick
 - 5. Chests were used for storage
 - 6. Paintings on wall of geometric shapes or nature
 - E. A lot of activity occurred on the roof (some cooking and sleeping because of the cool wind)
